Hi everyone,

Just a quick update on club stuff. Attached are two items re outdoor competitions. As always we are dependant on members assisting with the running of these events. These competitions bring in a substantial amount of money to the club each year, which allows us to keep costs to members as low as possible, but we need your help to continue. ### **Target Days**

We are hoping to provide more opportunities this year for club members to shoot and score official rounds. To facilitate this, Dot is arranging set Target Days with a specific round to be shot on each day, dates will follow soon.

### **Club Coaching**

Our coaches are looking at the best way to provide appropriate coaching for members, realising it can be difficult to ask for assistance, and to assist newer as well as more experienced members, they will from now on be offering dedicated coaching sessions between 10 – 11 am Sunday. Jan, Peter and Richard (from now on known as JPR!!) will be available at this time on a rota basis, some weeks all being there if possible, with the rota being displayed in the container. JPR are hoping this will offer a flexible approach that suits everyone, obviously if someone requires coaching at other times this will be possible. Coaching is best considered to be a two way relationship, which does not need to be particularly regimented or formal, but enjoyable for both archer and coach.

Club Sessions Friday 6 – 8 Sun 10 - 1

We are now well into the outdoor season, so just a few reminders:

If possible, please arrive on time in order to assist with setting up the field, or stay to clear the field. Outdoor shooting is a lot more work than indoors, and it is not acceptable to not be involved in at least one part of the process. We know it isn't possible for everyone to arrive on time, especially on Friday, and other commitments mean leaving before the session ends, but we ask that everyone cooperates to make life easier for all.

Boundary poles and tape must be used at all official club sessions, even if there are only a few archers shooting.

In the event of lost arrows, follow the procedure which is displayed in container.

Code of Conduct is on display, could everyone refresh themselves on this.

Remember there are no club sessions on the Sundays we hold competitions.
